Description

- Admission of international university students involves the arduous task of determining if the secondary education completed abroad equals or exceeds institutional requirements.
- Evaluating secondary programs longer than 12 years of full-time study can result in the award of post-secondary credit at many North American universities. Post-secondary credit can also be earned through Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, and similar college-preparatory programs.
- This workshop presents an overview of the transfer credit processes at North American universities for international students completing 12+ year secondary programs, credit for Advanced Placement, and International Baccalaureates.

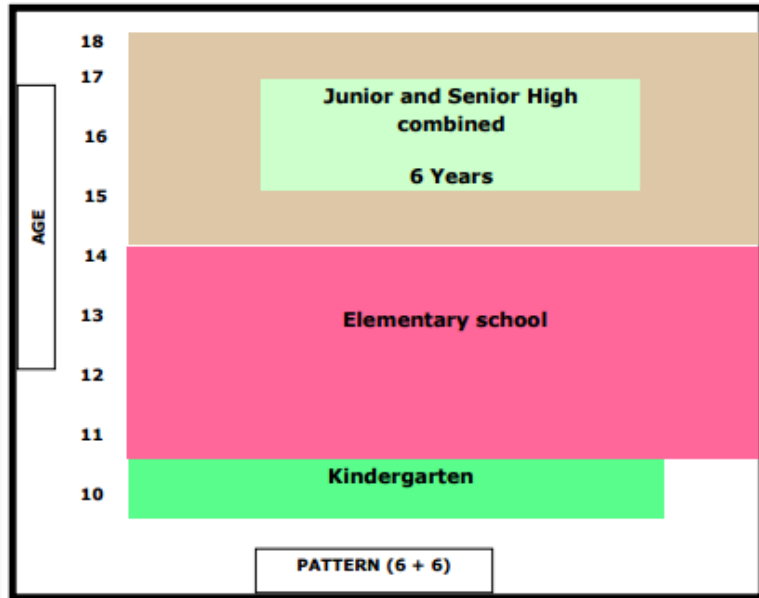
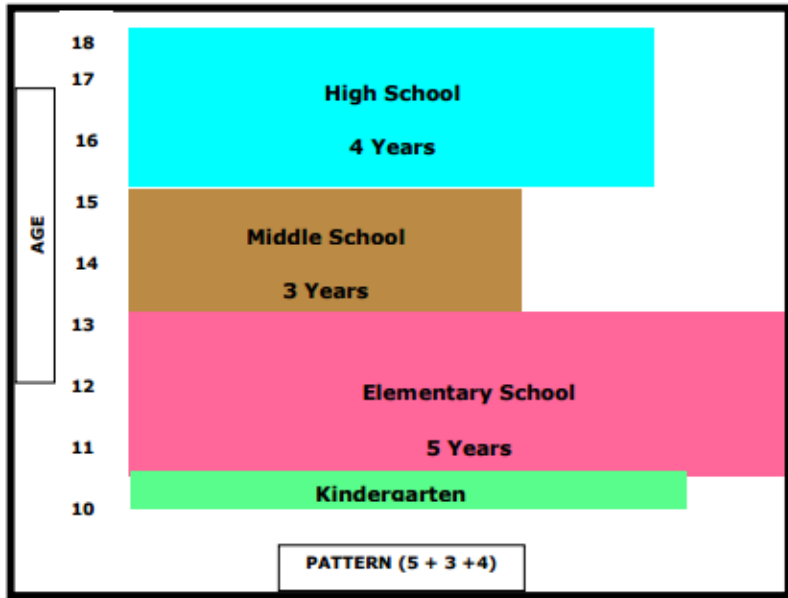
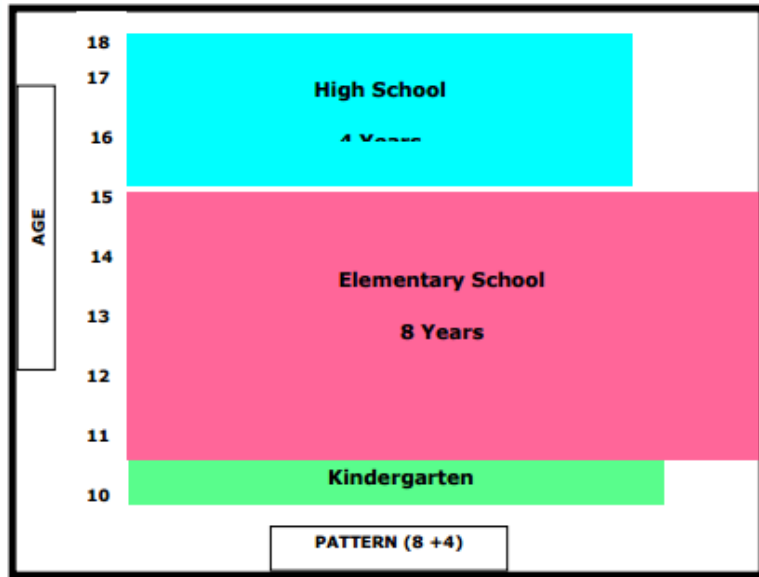
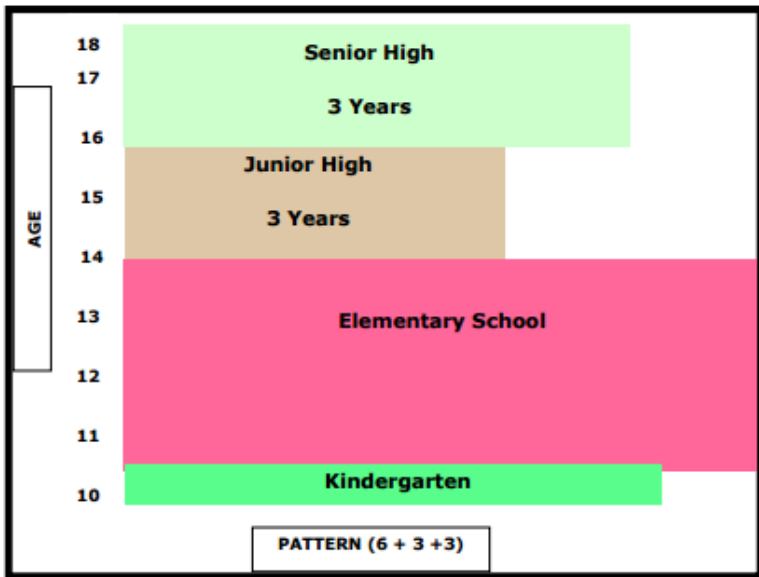
School Leaving Qualifications – United States

- School-level education is considered to be comprehensive from year 1 through year 12
- The high school diploma is the basic U.S. qualification awarded to students who graduate from secondary school after 12 years of formal instruction
 - High school diplomas are issued by states or local districts to public school graduates, and by the school to private school graduates
 - Compulsory education is based on ages 5 to 16. In some states, it is 18.

Three types of High School Diplomas:

- General high school diploma tracks meets the state minimum requirements for graduation.
- Vocational diploma tracks exceed the state minimum requirement and add instruction in career subjects plus applicable mathematics and science requirements.
- Academic preparatory diploma tracks also exceed the state minimum requirements by adding additional mathematics, English, foreign language and science instruction. In addition, some states and schools award honors or Regents diplomas for students whose academic preparatory programs meet specific requirements, and many students graduate in Advanced Placement (AP) courses.

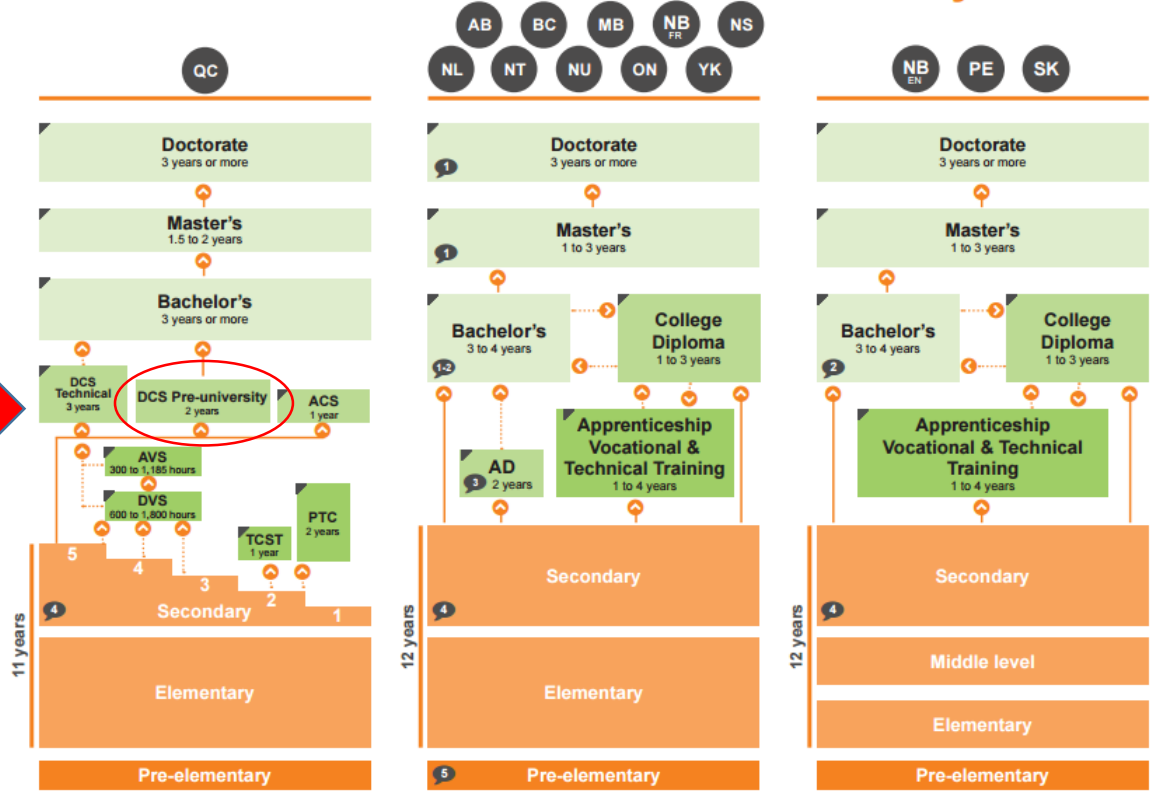
Patterns of US primary and secondary education



School Leaving Qualifications, Education System - Canada

- The right to deliver university-level programs and grant prescribed university degrees and applied bachelor's degrees has been granted to public colleges in Northwest Territories, Nunavut, and Yukon through legislation. However, some degree programs delivered are currently offered through partnerships with educational institutions in other Canadian jurisdictions.
- Select colleges and/or institutes in Alberta, British Columbia, Manitoba, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, and Saskatchewan also have some degree-granting authority. In British Columbia, all bachelor's degrees are four years in duration.
- Associate degrees (ADs) are offered only in British Columbia. AD holders obtain two years of transfer credit toward a four-year bachelor's degree.
- In all jurisdictions, a secondary-school diploma is issued upon successful completion of the secondary-school curriculum.
- In Nova Scotia, the elementary system consists of seven years, including Grade Primary, followed by Grades 1 to 6.

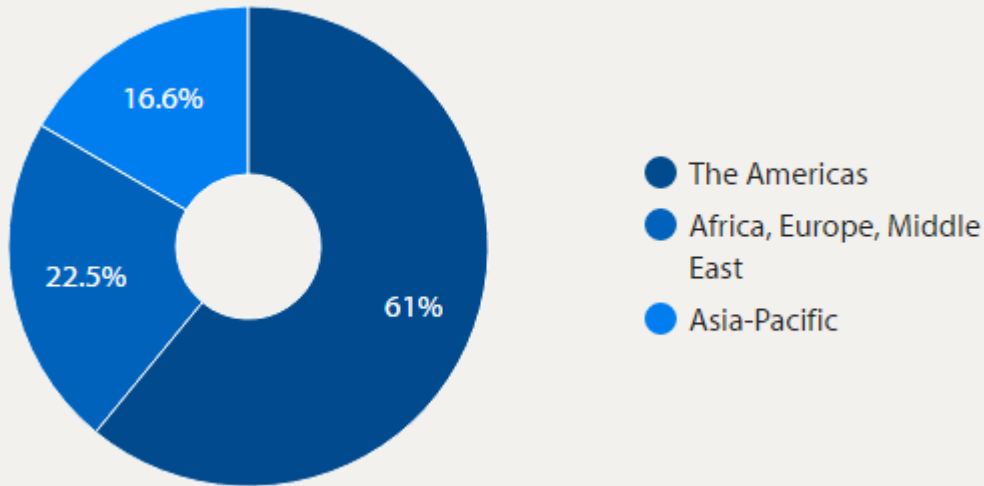

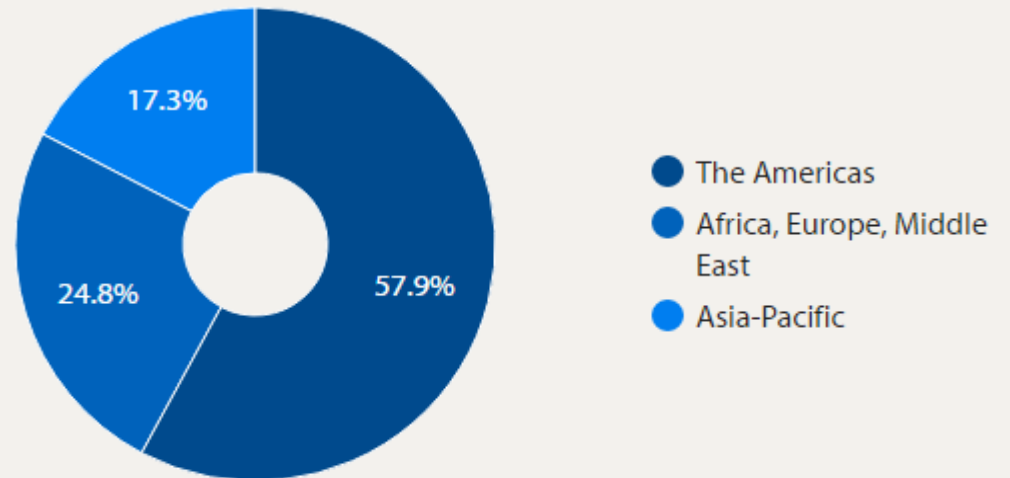

International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Program (DP)

- DP core and six subject groups
 - Core = Theory of Knowledge, Extended Essay, and Creativity and Activity Space
 - Subject groups
 - Language and Literature, Language acquisition, Individuals and Societies, Sciences, Mathematics, the Arts.
 - Higher Level (HL) and Standard Level (SL)
 - Each student takes at three to four subjects at the higher level
 - Frequently up to one year of credit
 - Subject Group Higher Level (HL) subjects only
 - Grade-dependent
 - Varies across institutions
